

How to tell whether a childcare provider meets your needs

Checklist tour

There are many childcare providers to choose from, and it is not always immediately clear what makes each one different. So how do you decide which one is right for your child?

The spaces and atmosphere

- The atmosphere at the location feels warm and welcoming
- Children are grouped with others in the same age range
- I have a good feeling about the Childcare Professionals
- There is a quiet sleeping area for the children
- The location looks clean and well cared for
- There is a calm area for babies
- There is an inviting outdoor play area and/or garden



The location

- The location is easy to reach from my home and/or work
- I can easily park my bike or car



Pedagogical vision and quality

- There is a clear pedagogical vision that I support
- Children's development is actively encouraged
- Each child's individual needs and own pace receive personal attention
- The day follows a consistent daily rhythm
- Indoors and outdoors, children play with play materials that stimulate their creativity
- From time to time, trips are organised and children are transported safely



What do the children eat?

- Children are offered warm and/or healthy meals and snacks
- Allergies are taken into account
- There are set times for eating and drinking



Practical matters

- There is a spot available for my child in good time
- The opening hours suit my needs
- It is possible to swap childcare days



Support and communication

- The childcare provider sees parenting and my child's development as a partnership, and I can turn to them with questions
- Parent meetings are held to talk about my child's development
- There is room for a handover moment when I drop off and pick up my child
- I receive daily updates through an app, including photos and messages
- I am actively informed about developments at the childcare provider and their pedagogical vision
